This temple has long been known as a "temple of winning luck", and attracts worshippers from all around the world who seek "winning luck" in all aspects of life. Visitors are amazed by the countless Daruma-Mikuji (Daruma Fortune Slips) placed across the grounds, and jam-packed displays of Kachi-Daruma (Winning Daruma) offerings. With approximately 80,000 square meters of land, it is also famous for its beautiful cherry blossoms, hydrangeas, and maple trees. **6**072-721-7010

It was built near the waterfall by "En no gyouja" around 650 and was named "Minoh Temple" first. Later was renamed "Ryuanji". It is said that Ryuanji's Benzaiten is the first and the oldest of all the

temples. Monks from all over the country come and train here.

(Shoutengu Saikouji Temple)

Built by "En no gyouja", it is the first Japanese temple at which Daishokankiten arrived. "Daikokutenn", god of wealth, is worshiped there, so many people come to pray. Springtime to autumn season is beautiful, with cherry blossoms and different types of maples. It is also famous for "Mushi Kuyou", "Tengu Matsuri" and "Kesoufumi", which is a good luck charm for relationships.






